

MILITARY SERVICE ACT, 1916

Every man to whom the Act applies will on Thursday, March 2nd, be deemed to have enlisted for the period of the War unless he is exempted or exempt.

Any man who has adequate grounds for applying to a Local Tribunal for a

CERTIFICATE OF EXEMPTION UNDER THIS ACT

Must do so BEFORE
THURSDAY, MARCH 2

Why wait for the Act to apply to you?

Come now and join of your own free will. You can at once put your claim for exemption from being called up before a Local Tribunal if you wish.

MILITARY SERVICE ACT, 1916

EVERY UNMARRIED MAN OF MILITARY AGE

Not excepted or exempted under this Act

CAN CHOOSE ONE OF TWO COURSES:

- (1) He can ENLIST AT ONCE and join the Colours without delay;
- (2) He can ATTEST AT ONCE UNDER THE GROUP SYSTEM and be called up in due course with his Group.

If he does neither, a third course awaits him:

HE WILL BE DEEMED TO HAVE ENLISTED under the Military Service Act

ON THURSDAY, MARCH 2ND, 1916.

HE WILL BE PLACED IN THE RESERVE, AND BE CALLED UP IN HIS CLASS, as the Military Authorities may determine.
